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## THE JAQUITH FAMILY

Peter Henderson Jaquith of New York and Missouri, compiled a neatly hand printed chart of the Jaquith family about 1897. He was careful about dates but left out almost all place names covering birth, marriage and death. However some of his correspondence in gathering data from his relatives was preserved which locates them and some have been found in the census records. A distant cousin, Alice Jaquith of Andover, Mass., wrote him giving him most of the records of the early ancestors, as she had access to the original records. In 1896 she wrote, "I have ransacked the town records and ancient graveyards of Wilmington, the records, cemetery and public library of Woburn and am quite pleased with my success." Again she wrote "I can hardly say I am writing a Jaquith genealogical book, but I am collecting all the material possible for the time when such a book may be written." Unfortunately her own line was not included in the work Peter Jaquith did, but she explains that her great-great-grandfather Benjamin, born in 1716, was a brother of Peter Jaquith's great-great-grandfather, Abraham 4th. All this material has been passed along from one member of the family to another and is now in the possession of Mrs. Katharine Crane Cox of Washington, D. C.

So far as we know, none of the material has ever appeared in any genealogy except for the first three generations that are included in *Morrill Kindred in America*, by Annie E. Morrill Smith, and there are scattered references to Jaquith women who married into other families.

Peter H. Jaquith credits his Aunt Julia (Jaquith) Rich, with an account of the early Jaquiths as follows—"During the religious persecutions in Europe in the 17th Century, three brothers by the name of Jaques, Huguenots, came over from France and settled in the Colony of Mass. In time they dropped the French termination of the name, and instead of Jaques, spelled it Jaquith. One of the descendants of this family, Benjamin Jaquith, by name, lived some years after the Revolutionary War at Billerica in Middlesex County, Mass."

The Jaquith line, according to S. G. Scoville, writing in *Americana* in April 1930, came from England. He says, "Various forms of Jaquith are given in the New England Register, among them Jackewish, Jacquesh, Jacquish and Jaques. All of them are no doubt first from Jaques with reference to Jakes, baptismal name for the son of John, from the nickname Jack or Jake but when found as Christian name Jaques stood for James."

The family of Jaques appears to be an old one of England. Burke mentions a baronetcy in Middlesex County that was extinct in 1630 (or 1654). Another branch of the family was at York, which was knighted by Charles I (Bardsley, *Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames*). Abraham Jaquith was admitted to church membership in 1643. He was a freeman in 1655-56, married Anna Jordan, daughter of James Jordan of Dedham, Mass. . . ."

Peter Jaquith's brother Alfred wrote him: "The Syracuse Jaquiths spelled their name Jaqueth. Mother asked Sampson why they had changed the orthography. He replied, 'Oh, to get rid of the trouble of dotting that i'".

After some months of work on these records, checking them so far as possible, I am glad to know they are now preserved for future generations. I feel that Peter H. Jaquith should also have the epitaph sent to him by Alice Jaquith from the headstone of her ancestor, Benjamin Jaquith.

"Tho gone he is not dead  
No good man dies;  
But like the day star,  
Only sets to rise."
